## Face Value —A biopsychosocial workshop

### **Purpose of the Workshop:**

To provide information and training concerning the psychosocial issues faced by patients who have an orofacial cleft and other related facial disorders. It will target issues concerning facial appearance including facial clefts, scarring, body image, treatment options and psychology. Guest presenter Dr Martin Persson.

### **Background and relevance of Workshop:**

With the current levels of health funding, the resources required to identify, assess and manage psychosocial issues may be scarce or not available in the team or multi-disciplinary arenas. To provide a multidisciplinary approach tools are required to identify the need for potential psychological and counselling referrals and interventions. This workshop is a timely and necessary information source for providing care and the resources required by our cleft teams and other professionals to provide care.



### **Outcomes:**

Participants will be able to:

- 1) Understand how individuals with orofacial cleft (OFC) and/ or other related facial disorders may be affected by:
  - a) societal influences
  - b) specific psychosocial issues related to OFC from a life-span perspective and
  - c) how these aspects relate to their provision of care.
- 2) Identify how psychosocial provision of care functions in their department.
- 3) How to implement a psychosocial approach in their department .

#### **Program Topics:**

- Appearance/body image
  - Societal influence
- What are the psychological issues:
  - For parents/families
  - Children
  - Adolescents
  - Adults
- Long term outcomes in adults from a medical-psychological-social perspective.









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
